A 2 YEAR UNIT INVESTMENT TRUST

Investment Objective

The Trust seeks to provide investors with the possibility of above-average total return (a total return that exceeds that of the S&P 500 Index over the life of the Trust). Total return may include dividends, interest, capital appreciation, and/or distributions. The Portfolio Consultant sought securities whose historical, fundamental profitability metrics have generally been superior to industry peers. There is no guarantee that the investment objective of the Trust will be achieved.

Strategy of Portfolio Selection

The Trust seeks to achieve its objective through investment in the publicly traded common and preferred stock of companies and shares of closed-end investment companies (the "Funds"). The portfolio was selected by Value Architects Asset Management LLC (the "Portfolio Consultant"). The Portfolio Consultant selected stocks of companies (other than the Funds) in the following sectors: consumer products and services, energy, financials, health care, industrials, information technology, materials, and utilities. These companies are diversified among large, mid and small capitalization companies. For the Funds portion of the portfolio, the Portfolio Consultant selected Funds that invest primarily in fixed income securities of U.S. and/or foreign issuers. The Funds generally may invest in corporate and government debt obligations and other fixed income securities. The Trust does not directly invest in fixed income securities. Certain Funds invest in emerging markets and/or high yield, high risk bonds ("junk" bonds). As used herein, the term "Securities" means the shares of common and preferred stocks of companies and Funds initially deposited in the Trust and contracts and funds for the purchase of such securities, and any additional securities acquired and held by the Trust pursuant to the provisions of the Trust Agreement.

Description of Portfolio

The portfolio of the Trust contains 48 issues of equity securities of domestic and foreign companies, including 6 Funds and 3 issues of preferred stocks. 100% of the issues are represented by the Sponsor's contracts to purchase such Securities. Based upon

the principal business of each issuer and current market values, the following sectors are represented by the common stocks of the companies in the portfolio (and does not include the Funds whose portfolios are not fixed): consumer products and services, energy, financials, health care, industrials, information technology, materials, and utilities.

Distributions will fluctuate as a result of Unitholder redemptions in addition to securities being sold within the portfolio. Distributions are also subject to the ability of issuers to make dividend payments in the future.

²Estimated Net Annual First Year Distribution per Unit is computed by dividing the estimated annual income of the underlying securities less the expense per unit by the number of units outstanding. The estimated net annual distributions for subsequent years are expected to be less than estimated distributions for the first year because a portion of the securities included in the Trust portfolio will be sold during the first year to pay for organization costs, the creation and development fee and the deferred sales charge. The actual net annual distributions will vary with changes in the Trust's fees and expenses and income of the underlying securities.



Risk Considerations

Unitholders can lose money by investing in this Trust. The value of the Units, the Securities and the securities held by the Funds included in the portfolio can each decline in value. An investment in Units of the Trust should be made with an understanding of the following risks:

- Since the portfolio of the Trust is unmanaged, in general, the Sponsor can only sell Securities under certain extraordinary circumstances, at the Trust's termination or in order to meet redemptions. As a result, the price at which each Security is sold may not be the highest price it attained during the life of the Trust.
- Price fluctuations of particular Securities will change the portfolio's composition throughout the life of the Trust. When cash or a letter of credit is deposited with instructions to purchase Securities in order to create additional Units, an increase in the price of a particular Security between the time of deposit and the time that Securities are purchased will cause the Units to be comprised of less of that Security and more of the remaining Securities. In addition, brokerage fees incurred in purchasing the Securities will be an expense of the Trust and such fees will dilute the existing Unitholders' interests.
- The risk that the financial condition of the issuers of the common stocks in the Trust and comprising the portfolios of the Funds may become impaired or that the general condition of the stock market may worsen (both of which may contribute directly to a decrease in the value of the Securities and thus in the value of the Units).
- Securities of foreign companies held by the Trust and by the Funds present risks beyond those of U.S. issuers. These risks may include market and political factors related to the company's foreign market, international trade conditions, less regulation, smaller or less liquid markets, increased volatility, differing accounting practices and changes in the value of foreign currencies.
- Certain of the Securities are shares of closed-end funds which frequently trade at a discount from their net asset value in the secondary market. The amount of such discount is subject to change from time to time in response to various factors.
- Unitholders will pay both Trust expenses and will also indirectly bear a share of each Fund's expenses.
- Certain Funds may invest in high-yield debt obligations ("junk bonds") and senior loans, which consist of lower grade securities ("BBB" or lower by Standard and Poor's and "Baa" or lower by Moody's) or in comparable non-rated securities. While these lower rated securities offer a higher return potential than higher rated securities, they also involve greater price volatility and greater risk of loss of income and principal.
- The Trust and certain Funds may invest in companies with smaller market capitalizations, which may have less liquid stock and more volatile prices than larger capitalized companies. Such companies also tend to have unproven track records and, to a certain extent, are more likely to perform less well or fail than companies with larger market capitalizations.
- There is no assurance that any dividends will be declared or paid in the future on the Securities.
- The sponsor may offer successive Trusts with similar portfolios thereby allowing the investor to pursue the same strategy over a number of years. Investors should consider their ability to pursue investing in successive Trusts, if available. There may be tax consequences associated with investing in the Trust and rolling over an investment from one Trust to the next.
