Relative strength is a technical analysis tool that measures a security's performance relative to other securities in the same industry, a competitive industry, a benchmark or a broad market index. Relative strength is a momentum technique that relies on unbiased, unemotional and objective data, rather than biased forecasting and subjective research. Relative strength is a way of recording historic performance patterns, and the portfolio consultant uses relative strength signals as a trend indicator for current momentum and future performance trends of a security versus another one.

- Equally Weight 50 Strongest Companies Based on Rankings System







Risk Considerations

Unitholders can lose money by investing in this trust. An investment in units of the trust should be made with an understanding of the risks related to the trust, such as the following:

- Security prices will fluctuate. The value of your investment may fall over time.
